Procedures for Registering with the American Devon Cattle Association

How do I register animals?

Using forms provided by the ADCA registry office (located at Associated Registres in Milo, IA). Registration applications can be found on the ADCA website (www.americandevon.com) or are available upon request from the association office. It is preferred that they be mailed back to the office with proper payment, or can be faxed to 641-942-6502 or emailed to asregistry@yahoo.com.

To register Devon cattle breeders must be ADCA members, prove ownership of an animal and supply the ADCA with the following; Sex, Horn Status, Breeder ID/Name of Animal, Left Ear Tattoo, Breeding Type (method of pregnancy), Birthdate, Sire Reg# and Name/Tattoo, Dam Reg# and Name/Tattoo. Valid ADCA certificates will be issued to ADCA members who are in good standing with the ADCA. All valid registration certificates will contain the ADCA seal and the signature of the ADCA registrar at the time of issue.

How do I become a member of the ADCA?

Information and forms to join the ADCA can be found at www.americandevon.com or can be requested from the ADCA registry office (located at Associated Registries in Milo, IA). Farms/Individuals can obtain membership with a one time initiation fee and can maintain membership by paying their annual dues.

More information can be found on the ADCA and its rules and regulations by reading the association bylaws listed at the afore mentioned website.

What does an ADCA registration certificate mean?

It means you own a pure Devon animal. All animals registered and issued certificates by the ADCA are placed in the ADCA herd book which traces lineage back more than two centuries. Animals eligible for registration and admittance to the herd book must be pure Devon and meet breed standards.

NOTE: Animals registered are done so without inspection and therefore the ADCA relies on the integrity and honesty of its members for accurate registrations to be issued.

Can an animals registration be revoked?

The ADCA board of directors (BOD) reserves the right to review and possibly revoke the registration of any animal and all its progeny if the animal is suspected to be of different parentage than supplied the ADCA by the breeder. Animals are also subject to removal if the animal or its progeny does not meet breed standards.

I need help understanding the name and suffixes.

All animals born by Embryo Transfer (ET) or Artificial Insemination (AI) will have the corresponding code following their name on registration papers. (ie. Some Farms Sussie X804 AI)

All imported animals will have the Imported (IMP) designator placed after their name and the registry of origin like New Zeland (NZE). (ie. Special Farms T7 IMP NZE)

All animals transferred to the ADCA from outside/other Devon breed associations shall have the corresponding registry of origin placed after their name like AMDA or NADA. (ie. Special Farms U32 AMDA)

What about Tattoo's?

Ear tattoos are required on all registered Devon: The association will assign all new breeders a three letter herd code. Breeders must tattoo this code in the RIGHT ear of each of their calves. In the LEFT ear of each calf tattoo its herd number preceded by the year code letter for the year of its birth. W is the code for 2010, X for 2011 etc... (see list in next column). Actual tattoos must match numbers and letters on the registration certificate.

What about registration numbers?

All Devon approved by the ADCA for registration will have an ADCA registration number. Registration numbers are preceded by the horn status of the animal as listed by the breeder to the association. P24365 would be a Polled animal, D33745 would be a Dehorned animal. S denotes Scurred and H denotes Hornd. Animals whose registration numbers do not have a prefix were registered without the ADCA's knowledge of horn status.

How do I transfer ownership of a sold animal?

Registration certificates are to be properly filled out on reverse side and returned to the Association office with proper fees for transfer of ownership to occur. New owners will receive the same paper with their new ownership showing on the back of the paper with an approval stamp. It is the responsibility of the seller to transfer ownership of all sold cattle within 90 days.

What if I do not own the sire of calf to be registered?:

A properly completed Certificate of Lease or Loan of Bull from the owner of the sire. This must accompany the registration application for new offspring.

NOTE: All AI sires must have a ADCA registration paper, and DNA test result on file at the office of the American Devon Cattle Association before being allowed for AI or ET work.

Is anything extra required to register calves that were produced by AI?

The ADCA requires that the sire of any AI animal has a DNA case # recorded in the office. DNA can be obtained by semen or hair sample evaluation. Contact the ADCA for more information, or to inquire about a bulls eligibility and status for use as an AI sire. Semen on bulls obtained prior to 2005 shall be grandfathered into the registry and do not require DNA test. Also, you will need to mail a completed Artificial Insemination Certificate signed by the Technician & Owners with the registration application for the new calf.

How about Embryo Transplant Calves?

A DNA case number must be on file in the office for the Sire and Dam of all ET calves produced by embryo's collected after 2005. The calf will also have to have a DNA case # before receiving a registration number or paper from the office. Embryo's and semen obtained prior to 2005 shall be grandfathered into the registry and do not require DNA test. Also, you will need to mail a completed Embryo Transfer Certificate signed by the Technician & Owners with the registration application for the new calf.

How to know if a "Devon" from another country/registry will be accepted into the ADCA?

Unfortunately you do not. Any animal, semen, or embryos bought overseas or from other "Devon" registries must be approved by the ADCA before it and its calves can be registered with the ADCA. Please feel free to contact the ADCA with any questions or to have an outside registration approved.

NOTE: The ADCA strives to maintain a pure genetic pool in its herd book. All registries are reviewed with the sole purpose of verifying purity and maintaining breed standards.
